Synonyms: place, find, discover. Antonyms: lose, misplace.

man•u•fac•ture—man-yuh-FAK-cher verb to make by hand or with machinery
Synonyms: make, produce, create. Antonyms: destroy, demolish.

o•rig•i•nal—uh-RiHJ-uh-nuhl adjective 1. existing first 2. completely new and not copied
Synonyms: first, earliest, new. Antonyms: final, copy.

suf-fi-cient—suh-FIHSH-uhnt *adjective* as much as needed Synonyms: enough, plenty, ample. Antonyms: inadequate, poor.

un•lim•it•ed—uhn-LIH-mih-tuhd adjective 1. without limits 2. having no boundaries or end Synonyms: boundless, limitless. Antonyms: confined, bound.

van•ish—VAN-ihsh *verb* 1. to disappear suddenly 2. to stop existing Synonyms: disappear, go. Antonyms: appear, show.




